

Simulation-based Education

Our simulation facilities put you at the heart of the action. You could be the first on scene after a crime, interviewing witnesses, collecting DNA and digital evidence, or searching for fake goods.

Whatever the training scenario, you'll be able to practise your skills in a safe environment before doing the job for real.

We have invested £2.2m in 12 brand new simulation suites, which can be transformed into a wide range of incredibly life-like settings. These include bedrooms, bathrooms and lounges as well as a shop, office, hospital ward, custody suite and prison cell.

There is also an outdoor forensic area, along with two courtrooms where students can present cases and act as expert witnesses. Each suite has a debriefing area and is fitted with cameras so staff can observe the action from a control room and provide detailed feedback to students, who can then re-watch their performance to clearly understand what went well and where they can improve.

The Ashley 2 facilities on our Stoke-on-Trent campus give students a rounded experience. They can track a case from crime scene to courtroom and collaborate with students from other courses.

These spaces are at the heart of our innovative approach to learning, where students are immersed in hands-on experiences to prepare them for real-life scenarios.

We offer a range of pathways that are designed to lead into the police force.

Undergraduate Degrees

BSc (Hons) Professional Policing

- Designed for those who wish to become a constable and learn in a university setting. On this 'prejoin' degree, you will be able to apply to your chosen force straight from graduation.

BSc (Hons) Policing and Criminal Investigation – This broader degree allows you to explore other areas of policing and criminal investigation, leading to careers in a variety of investigative agencies such as police forces, the National Crime Agency, border agencies or the military.

Work-based Learning

Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship (PCDA)

 A three-year work-based learning programme where you study alongside operational duties.
 Recruitment is through our partner forces.

Degree Holder Entry Programme (DHEP) – A two-year programme for applicants who already possess a degree. It will equip you to succeed at graduate level. Apply for these work-based learning courses through your chosen force's website.



If you don't meet our Level 3 entry requirements, we now offer a policing-specific 10-week short course to develop your academic skills, getting you ready for your education in policing.

- Microplastics and Forensic Fibres Research Group





At University of Staffordshire, you won't just be learning the theory behind criminal investigation, you'll be living it.

In collaboration with Locate International, we have opened our very own Cold Case Unit to give assistance to police investigators and families of both missing and deceased people. You will help tackle unsolved cases and will have access to a network of international contacts.

Depending on your subject area, you could be asked to investigate a police-allocated cold case alongside other like-minded students and staff. Through our Cold Case Unit, you will have the chance to review cases, gather intelligence, work collaboratively with specialist organisations and teams, and provide working investigative reports to the police.

DR LEANNE SAVIGAR-SHAW


Senior Lecturer – Policing



Successful completion of this course provides one of the recognised routes into the police service. However, successful attainment does not in itself provide any guarantee of recruitment as a trainee police constable. Each police force within England and Wales sets out its own recruitment process and selection policy, and entry requirements may vary from force to force. Prospective students are therefore strongly advised to check the specific requirements of their chosen force prior to undertaking study.
